VOTING

FINANCIAL MEMBERS ONLY CAN VOTE. VISITORS, WHILST WELCOME, MAY NOT DISCUSS OR VOTE. (SEE ITEM 5)

3. IMPORTANT DECISIONS

ANY MATTERS WHICH MAY AFFECT - ALTER OR PERTAIN TO INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS WILL REQUIRE A NOTICE OF MOTION 14 DAYS PRIOR TO A MEETING. THIS WILL ENSURE ALL FINANCIAL MEMBERS WILL BE AWARE OF PROJECTED MOVES, WHICH IS THEIR RIGHT.

4. QUORUM

A QUORUM IS NECESSARY TO PROTECT THOSE WHO CANNOT BE PRESENT - PREVENT A LOADING OF A MEETING - THUS ASSURING A FAIR AND EQUAL DECISION - QUORUM TO BE FIVE ON PRESENT MEMBERSHIP AND TO BE REVIEWED WHEN NECESSARY.

5. MEMBERSHIP

FEES AT THE AGREED RATE, PRESENTLY \$15, COVERS BOTH SINGLE AND FAMILY MEMBERS I.E. HUSBAND AND WIFE OR COUPLE - PAID FEE COVERS ONE VOTE ONLY.
