



It can't possibly be.....but it is. Nearly 8 years have passed since the launch of the Endeavour replica, when many of us (an estimate of 70,000 people) witnessed the unforgettable sight of her sliding into the water on that December day in 1993. After having been fitted out, her eventual departure for her round the world voyage on 2nd October 1994 from Fremantle was to me, an even more dramatic occasion. We had brought Oriel down to the Inner Harbour well in time to wish Endeavour 'bon voyage', as had hundreds of other craft of every conceivable shape, size and description.

Consequently all this large fleet had to juggle around in the very limited water space for an hour or so waiting for Endeavour to actually set sail. It was all very exciting but we called it a day when we found ourselves locked in a close embrace with a surf boat - one of her oars resting across our foredeck and thus eliminating any remaining vestige of control we had so far enjoyed in this hectic situation. We eventually drifted down onto a police boat and after apologising profusely for the damage caused by our contact, disentangled ourselves and headed back up river.

All this leads to a please come down and welcome Endeavour's return on Saturday 15th December at Victoria Quay. She is due to berth between 9 and 10 o'clock but of course a sailing escort in from the Outer Harbour would be great. No drama for this event!






