Safety 5 8 1

- This event will be held in compliance with Section 4 of the OGA Operations Manual available on our website and will be an event type 3: OGAWA Day Events in Coastal Waters and Protected Waters where no Rescue Support is available.
- All participants are responsible for their own and the safety of their crew. Skippers are to ensure that their boat is well prepared for this event. A safety briefing will be held before set off each day.
- All skippers are requested to fill out and submit the "Annual C Fleet Self-Assessment Safety Form".
- The organisers have the right to cancel or modify any day's event if the weather conditions are adverse, however it is the Skipper's sole responsibility to decide whether to start or withdraw at any time.
- All participants in open boats must be confident that they can recover their boats from a capsize.
- In preparing your boats for the rally we require as a minimum that the following equipment is carried
 - PFDs for all crew (please wear them!)
 - DoT requirements for coastal waters (both the old and the new requirements are legal this year – check their website)
 - A waterproof marine VHF radio (we intend to use VHF channel 72) and preferably an EPIRB or PLB.
 - o Good anchoring gear (we will be anchoring in various locations)
 - o A robust torch (we don't intend to night-sail, but could be caught out)
 - Waterproof and warm clothing (it can be cold and you want to be comfortable this is <u>not</u> an endurance test)
 - First aid kit
 - o Spare rope (towing, additional mooring lines, and to cover breakages)
 - Dry bags for spare clothes
 - Adequate food and water each day
- Check out the DoT Walpole to Denmark Boating Guide and Charts WA1046 and DMH337 and the relevant Notices to Mariners.

Walpole & Denmark OGA Rally

Logistical Plan

Wednesday 28th February

Drive to Walpole and set up camp/accommodation in area but leave boats on trailers. 18.00 onwards: meet at Walpole Hotel Motel for drinks/dinner and planning for the next two days.

Thursday 29th February

Trail boats through to Denmark (1 hour max)

Launch at Denmark Rivermouth for a day's sail on Wilson Inlet including a picnic lunch stop (byo picnic)

Trail boats back to Walpole

Depending how the day goes, evening meal could be either in Denmark or Walpole

Friday 1st March

There are a number of sailing/rowing/motoring options available in and around the Walpole and Nornalup inlets and weather/inclination depending, we have options such as:

- Sail around Newdegate Island and explore up Deep River on the west side of the Nornalup Inlet (but be aware it is not "Deep"!)
- Sail to Sealers Cove on the south side of the inlet for lunch and walk the track over the dunes to Circus Beach (take a backpack and watch out for snakes).
- Sail to the east side of the inlet and see how far we can get up the Frankland River lunch at Nornalup? If the weather is really bad on the Inlet we could even launch at Nornalup)
- Or just have a good sail around the inlet and up to Walpole town ramp to find that coffee shop a competitive sprint up the narrows should show up our boat handling skills!

Then about 1800 onwards gather at one of the campsites for a BBQ, followed by a good night's sleep before the challenge of the next two days at the Walpole In the Trees Regatta.

Accommodation

There are a full range of "country" options for accommodation in and around Walpole - check out www.walpole.com.au for details.

The two main caravan/camp sites are Rest Point, and **Coalmine Beach**, the latter being where the Regatta is held and books up early, so be quick! (maybe too late already, but if you have trouble booking a site let me know – we look to have spaces available within our group)

Coalmine Beach is likely your best option, if sites available, and it will be used by the event organiser as our central meeting/contact point - Camp Site 16 (or thereby) will display the OGA banner.

Launching and Retrieving

There are three launch ramps in the inlet:

- The Town Ramp in Walpole (best for deeper trailer sailers)
- The Rest Point Ramp (by the campsite of same name) opposite Walpole
- The **Coalmine Beach Ramp** (by the campsite of same name) south of Walpole, on the Nornalup Inlet (most of us have used this ramp but it is into fairly shallow water)
