

## North Yunderup Yacht Club Invitation Race

North Yunderup Yacht Club invites the Old Gaffers Association to race on Saturday 24 January 2026. The race is on the Murray River starting at 1430 from 188 Culeenup Road, North Yunderup. The closest is a boat ramp at 110 Culeenup Road. Social sailing in the surrounding waterways before the race is encouraged and we are happy to provide people with lifts back to their starting boat ramps after the race.

There is a second race on Monday 26 January that everyone is welcome to join also. Start time for this race is 1500, otherwise all other details are the same.

### Schedule

1400 – Race briefing – 186 Culeenup Road – boats can be beached or moored out the front

1430 – Race start - 188 Culeenup Road


1530 – Afternoon tea (provided by NYYC)- 186 Culeenup Road

### Closest Boat Ramp – North Yunderup Boat Ramp

Boats can be rigged here as trees are limited and there is parking. Be aware the ramp can have a steep drop off at the end that can be problematic at low tide.

Overflow parking options: on the road next to Kingfisher Park or the properties owned by club members: 111, 186 & 188 Culeenup Road.

### Course Description

Both the starting line and the finishing line are the projection of the eastern end of the Club jetty. Two vertical posts will be attached to the jetty to assist competitors. There are no defined lateral limits.

The full course is from the starting line heading downstream, clockwise around the marker (on your starboard) approximately midstream out from the launching ramp, upstream continuing over the starting/finishing line, anticlockwise around the marker (on your port) approximately midstream out from jetty 0063 and returning downstream to the finishing line.

When the reverse course is being sailed, the markers are to be passed on the same side as for the normal course.

Two short courses are possible depending upon whether the sailing direction is normal or reverse. In either case, the short course is from the start to the next crossing of the starting/finishing line. The timekeeper may signal the short course any time up to one minute after the first yacht has crossed the short course finishing line. As a guide, the short course will be signalled if, in the judgement of the timekeeper, the slowest competitor will take more than forty-five minutes to complete the short course.

When no markers have been set or have been severely displaced, the downstream mark will be deemed to have been passed when the mast is clearly past a projection of the centre of the launching ramp and the upstream mark will be deemed to have been passed when the outside of the eastern wall of boatshed 0063 is visible from the mast position.

Standard commencement time is 1500. The clock by the jetty, when in place, will be used as the official time. If it is not in place, then the clock on the clubhouse will be used. Failing both, the starter's timepiece shall be used.
